In the name of God I Joseph Vance of the County of Fayette State of Kentucky, calling to mind my mortality & that it is appointed to all men once to die, do make & constitute this my last will & testament in form & manner following. My body I commend to the earth to be buried in a Christian decent manner at the discretion of my executor. Nothing doubting but that I shall receive it again at the resurrection of the Just or the great Judgment day & my Spirit I recommend to God who give it. And with regard to those temporal good things with which God has been pleased to endow me I declare as follows I by these presents give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anne Vance the exclusive right in and to my land with the furniture & household belonging together with all my personal estate unto the day of her death and the one half that shall then remain in her to will or dispose of as shall seem meet to her as to do (But my executor I hereby authorize to sell of what of my property shall be necessary or that they may think expedient and likewise pay all my debts, &c. she shall have the full possession of the hundred acres of land to be laid off to the best advantage around the same house so as to take in a good portion of more land to adjoin the land of John Porter as far as it may govern. The money she shall receive by my executor this together with any my negro man shall set to red for her use to the end of her natural life if she shall think it will be more to her advantage to sell the said negro then no that case my executor shall sell him and pay her one third of the money to her as she shall have. I will also bequeath unto my grandson William Vance the whole right and title in and to the several lands and one hundred acres of land to be laid off at the

death of my wife aforesaid. If she shall be called in before my said grandson William arrive at the age of twenty one years then the said house and plantation shall be run by his guardian for his use and benefit the balance of my land I will & bequeath unto my other grand children (to wit) Elizabeth Vance, Isaac Vance & Ann Vance the same to be equally divided in quantity and quality so that they be about 1/3 be that their mother my daughter shall have any more children there is named above to inherit the balance of my land in that case they shall all be equal chances as near as can be in the division - And at the death of my wife I will that all the personal estate that then remains be sold and the one half of the monies arising therefrom I will to be equally divided between my daughter Isaac Vance and her children. I also will and bequeath unto my said daughter Isaac & her husband the full and free use of all that part or parcel of land that I have willed above unto my grandchildren viz Elizabeth Isaac & Ann & unto the end of their present life, to use as their own but not to sell or dispose of. Should they live until they said children arrive to maturity then a division shall take place and each one have their own and enjoy the benefit of the same, but my daughter and her husband shall have the privilege of living on any part they may choose for life and draw from each share when kind of and look out of their possession one third of the rent that may arise from the same. I wish also that each of my grandchildren have guardians appointed to them to see that their said land is not abused or that any unnecessary waste committed thereon. I do further constitute and appoint my worthy friends David Egger, Esq. and James Vance of the said County of Fayette executors of this my last will and testament and directing and commanding by these presents all business to be done and performed by them or any of them in and about the same to be done and performed.

In the name of God Amen this seventeenth of September one thousand eight hundred and three, I Patrick McCullough of the County of Lexington and Commonwealth of Kentucky being informed of my death and desirous before my departure here to settle and adjust my earthly concerns do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit I shew the first I will and ordain that all my just debts to be paid and satisfied to my creditors. Item second Whereas I have a niece ^{now} in the Kingdom of Ireland born by the name of Jane Workman I wish that she receive from my estate the sum of one thousand dollars, of the value of three hundred and pounds ^{currency of Kentucky} and the third I do hereby declare that the said Kingdom of Ireland by Margaret Workman ^{my} signed Drumsmond Jane McCullough his wife married a Mr Conroy Wick and Samuel McCulloch in w^h the heirs of John McCulloch deceased whose names I do not remember now I will and ordain that the said Margaret Workman be one equal share signed Drumsmond one equal share the said Jane McCulloch one equal share James McCulloch one equal share and the heirs of John McCulloch deceased one equal share of my estate whether real personal or mixed. Item the fourth I will that after my decease my body be buried in a decent manner and at the expense of the temple & independently of my
