This being the appearance of the estate of John Hafford dec'd
Rebecca Grant claims to be the estate of Amos Hafford dec'd.

In the name of God Amen I William Hafford of the County
of Jayette and State of Kentucky being sound
mind memory, full weak and body do make and set and
this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all
others by me made before or done in any way whatsoever
and first I do recommend my soul to God Almightly who
gave it to me and my body to the dust to be buried in
a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter
after to be named not doubting that what I leave at the
general resurrection and as to my worldly estate that it
be divided one with, I give and bequeath in the
following manner I do give to my son George Clarke I give
and bequeath the sum of one dollar and to my son William
Clarke the sum of one dollar, to my son James Clarke
the sum of four hundred fifty dollars to be paid him
out of a debt due to me from Jacob Muspham of the State
of Pennsylvania, provided that amount shall be received
or received from the said Muspham and shall then not
be that sum got from him in that case the deficiency to
be made good to my son James out of my lands which I
now live on in North Elkhorn not having otherwise disposed
of and which lands shall be sold at the discretion of my son
John Holmes and James his wife which we to occupy my own
plantation during the natural life or other of them.
