In the name of God Amen, Robert Campbell of the County of Lexington Virginia
 County and State of Kentucky, being weak in body but of sound mind and memory
 considering the Certainty of Death and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and being desirous
 to settle my worldly Affairs and thereby to be better prepared to leave this World, please
 it shall please God to take me hence do therefore make and constitute this my last
 Will and Testament in manner and full following: My wife and desire is that
 after my funeral Charges and other my just debts are paid, that the remainder of my
 Estate be disposed of in the following manner: Item I give unto my beloved Wife
 Elizabeth Campbell one acre of ground named Dutch holes and her heirs for ever.
 Item I give to my Brother John Campbell at my decease, as my Willing appeared
 and Twenty Dollars twelve months after my decease, to him and his heirs for ever.
 Item I give to my Son John Campbell the Brick House and Lot whereon he lives on
 Water Street, supposed to be twenty two and a half feet in width and half the length
 between the two Houses and extending back six and a half poles, with all the appurtenances
 thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining, also one half being the south east 300 of
 that piece of ground which lies between the House wherein the said Catherine now lives
 and Robert Wans Lot, supposed to be with other eighty five feet front on Water Street,
 and six and a half poles back to the Division Line between the Whittier of the Lot on
 Water Street and to East and North of the Whittier, of the back Lane, also one acre and 100 paces
 which I thought of to be given to Thomas Comor as recorded in deed bearing date
 the 27th day of June 1798 and also one acre of the same thing for the amount
 of one hundred Dollars to pay for a Horse which I received of him when he
 returned from Philadelphia to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give to my Son James
 Campbell the Lot of ground between the Streets of the new town, in High Street
 measuring sixty four feet in width and two hundred and sixteen feet and a half
 back, beginning to be run from East West and N. E. bearing and the 13th day of
 November 1798 between the two spaces of ground which I thought of to be
 given to said Lot, agreed to be run from said Doree, and the 13th day of
 the 27th day of May 1798 with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging also one acre
 of Lot lying between fifth and Sixth Streets in the place of the same in 1799 and 1800
 agreed to be a Deed from the Trustees bearing date the 20th day of February 1797
 and a Deed from Christian Speers bearing date the 12th day of August 1798 also
 one fourth part and quarter second share, the above named two Lots only making
 his part equal with the other two, to whom he has given a Deed which he
 sold also one half of the ground supposed described on Water Street, between the House
 that John Campbell now lives in and Robert Wans Lot, supposed to be
 eighty five feet front and six and a half poles back being the same next to
 the said Catherine House, supposed to be forty two and a half feet on Water Street
 to the Division Line, and extending the whole length of the Lot back to
