This last will and testament of Peter Webster deceased

October 29<sup>th</sup> 1804. Bearing in mind that it is appointed  
to all men once in three years. I Robert Lyle of Fayette County &  
State of Kentucky do make and express this my last will and  
testament. 1<sup>st</sup> it is my will that all my just debts  
and funeral expenses be paid by my Executor hereafter to be  
appointed. 2<sup>nd</sup> It is my will that my wife Jane Lyle  
shall have a support on the land which I lately purchased and

the use of the dwelling house on the same, and the negro girl  
Dinah to be at her command during her life provided she shall  
be obedient for the benefit of the mortgage. 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and it is my will that my land be vested in my  
son John Lyle to him and his heirs forever. I also will to him  
my waggon and horse gear and farming utensils of every kind  
provided he will maintain his mother during her life and the  
children that are under age until the arrival at that period.  
4<sup>th</sup> It is my will that the stock be appraised and the value  
thereof together with three hundred and eighty five dollars be  
given to my daughters in equal proportions to be paid in  
property or cash as they can agree.

5<sup>th</sup> It is my will that the money due to me in Virginia be  
applied to the payment of the balance due Mr. Walker for the  
land.

6<sup>th</sup> It is my will that the household and kitchen  
furniture remain for the use of the family that may reside together.  
7<sup>th</sup> It is my will that out my negro girl Dinah should survive  
after the death of my wife that she be given to my daughter  
Julia to be & her heirs but she is not to be sold out of my family.

And lastly I hereby constitute and appoint John Calkins & John  
Lyle sole Executors of this my last will and testament hereby  
revoking all wills heretofore made.
