Pursuant to an Order of the Hon^{ble} Fayette County Court made May Court 1813, the Commission^{ers} therein appointed, first duly sworn have received that part of the Books bought Road, passing through Joseph Smith's land beginning at the end of his land towards Lexington, and to intersect the new road proposed by said Surveyor which is marked out and are of opinion that the Public will sustain no inconvenience by turning the Road as proposed which will be on better ground. The distance of the new Road proposed is three hundred Yards, many of which is some what ascending entirely passable for loaded Waggon the old Road proposed to be abolished is about one hundred and fifty Yards some what ascending extremely Rocky. The new road proposed remains in the land of said Surveyor (He are) clearly of opinion that the new Road proposed will not be injurious to the Public or any Individual, as it appears that a convenient rule respect to the said Surveyor by turning the Roads as aforesaid which contains this 3rd day of June 1813


