 and as to my body I request it may be decently buried. Secondly  
 as to my worldly estate it is my desire that the property both  
 real and personal which I possess shall remain in the possession  
 of my beloved wife Catharine Simpson and as to be at her disposal  
 during her widowhood for the benefit of herself and my children  
 But if my wife should think it proper for her to marry  
 that case she must have what the law directs appertains to her  
 and the ballance of my estate equally divided amongst my children  
 Thirdly it is my desire that all the debts

a negro woman named Lucy now in the possession of my

Mother James Simpson which was to have been the property  
 of my Brother Gilbert Simpson deceased at the death of his  
 mother shall be given to the negro herself with a desire that she  
 may be free Lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved wife  
 Catharine Simpson sole executrix of this my last will and Testament
