In the name of God Amen, I Elly Chism of the County of Fayette and State of Kentucky being of sound mind do make and publish this my last will and testament in witness and form following to wit Whereas my Mother Jane Handy by her last will and testament duly executed did give and bequeath her share of two hundred

at eighteen except some married and in that case at their  
 marriage my will and desire is that my beloved wife Ellen  
 should have the maintenance and education of my eight last  
 mentioned children and the profits of their estates during their  
 minority or to their several marriages, my will is that in  
 order to fully enable my beloved wife to more completely  
 support and educate my last mentioned children and for to  
 own comfortable support, it is my will that she take into  
 her possession all the remainder of my estate both real and  
 personal, during her widowhood and the profits thereof  
 mutually to go for their support and education during their  
 minority, It is my will that after the death of my beloved  
 wife that the whole of my estate both real and personal shall  
 be equally divided among my last eight mentioned children  
 It is also my will that if that part of my personal estate that  
 can be best spared is not sufficient to pay my said debts  
 then it is my will that my beloved wife should sell and  
 convey my right to that tract of land which I hold near my  
 Brother Silvan Payne in Montgomery County and appropriate  
 the money arising to the payment of my debts, and the balance  
 of my to be equally divided between my last mentioned child  
 ren, My will is that if my beloved wife should marry then she is  
 to have one third part of my estate which is not particularly mention  
 ed, say the thirds to each of the children and the balance to  
 be equally divided among the last mentioned children at their  
 several marriages, my will is that my son Hugh shall pay off the  
 whole of his debts that I am security for, then he is to receive the same  
 and I am as his property, and further I do appoint my Brother

Henry Payne to sign and execute deeds of conveyance of  
 lands that belong to my father's estate in order to com-  
 plet and carry into effect an article of agreement  
 which was made by myself and brother and sister for the  
 Division of my father's estate among us, I make and  
 appoint my beloved wife Ellen my whole and sole execu-  
 trix of this my last will and testament, whereunto I  
 have set my hand and seal this 17th day of June 1808
