 as will fully appear by the said lots annexed we have also
 valued the slaves belonging to said dec'd estate as above stated and

 & personal estate as above stated and referred to was shown & reported to us
 by Henry Payne the administrator of said dec'd estate Given under our
 hands this 4th day of January 1812.
