 words. I give and bequeath unto my granddaughter  
 Nancy McGowan five hundred dollars to her and her heirs  
 forever. Now, I also give and bequeath unto my granddaughter  
 Sally Beard daughter of my son William Beard five hundred  
 dollars to her and her heirs forever. Now, I give and bequeath  
 unto my granddaughter Sally Beard daughter of my son  
 Joseph Beard five hundred dollars to her and her heirs forever.

It is my will and desire that my executors hereafter named  
 pay the above legacies to each of the legatees out of my estate as soon  
 as the debts concerning my land are adjusted as described in  
 an agreement this day entered into between Fortunatus Corby myself.  
 It is my will and desire that all the rest and residue of my estate be  
 equally divided amongst all my children. Lastly I nominate and  
 constitute and appoint my sons William Moore & Joseph Moore  
 executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof
