In the name of God amen I Joseph Bartholomew of Jayette County
 Kentucky being first duly sworn and swearing the
 uncertainty of human life I make certain and declare this to my last Will &
 Testament hereby repealing and annulling all former other Wills by me made and
 published. First I to my Wife and come that see my Just Debt unpaid
 References to punctually paid. Second I give and bequeath to my Sister Elizabeth
 Griffith one hundred Dollars to be paid to her by her Son Eleazer Griffith my
 Contract which he entered into with me for the 100 acres of Land whereon
 Bodley now lives in the State of Ohio near Dayton, Dated the 22nd day
 of June 1818 when the same are in said Contract. or immediately on my
 Decease, provided this then Die - I give to my Niece Elizabeth Griffith
 Daughter of Isaac and Elizabeth Griffith one hundred Dollars to be paid her
 by Eleazer Griffith in the same manner as the above mentioned 100 Dollars is
 directed to be paid. I also give and bequeath to my Niece Catharine Jones
 and Rachel Drey fifty Dollars each to be paid as above direct. by Eleazer
 Griffith. I also give and bequeath to the said Eleazer Griffith and his Son Joseph
 the other one hundred Dollars due me on said Contract. each to have fifty Dollars
 and in case of the death of either the Survivors to have the whole which is the last
 payment on said Contract. - It is further my Will and Desire that three
 hundred Dollars be put to Interest by my Executors hereon to be named for the use
 and Benefit of Elizabeth Isabella Thomas and John Bodley Children of John
 and Mary Bodley both Principals and Interest to be paid within respectively.

As they arrive at the age of Twenty one years or many in the following proportions
 That is to Elizabeth one hundred Dollars, Isabella one hundred Dollars
 each to Thomas and John fifty Dollars each, and in case of the death of one or more
 of said Children before they attain the age of Twenty one years the share or shares of
 the Deceased is to be equally divided between the Survivors as last the Survivor Within
 Case the said Elizabeth and Isabella is either of them who do not marry before they arrive at
 the age of Twenty one years they may Marry and do so that the Share or Shares of the said
 not marry as aforesaid shall be divided as aforesaid by my Executors within the aforesaid
 regularly paid them quarterly until they marry when and not till they do so receive
 the principal & further Wife and Child that two hundred Dollars be paid to Interest
 by my Executors for the use and benefit of myself the said Thomas Bodley and his Wife
 During the natural life of them in the Division of them the interest to be paid them annually
 or that the said Two hundred Dollars be laid out by appraisers of said Land which they or
 the Survivor of them are to occupy during their Life which ever they and my Executors may
 think most convenient and after the death of the said Thomas Bodley and his
 Wife the said two hundred Dollars or Land purchased thereunto is to be equally divided
 between Catharine Jones Rachel Drey Elizabeth Griffith Elizabeth Bodley
 and Isabella Bodley Daughters of John and Mary Bodley and their heirs
 for ever. I will and bequeath to Elizabeth Davis Widow of the late David Davis
 of Albion one hundred Dollars to be paid with my Just Debt and Frank with his
 Contents and William Lytle in satisfaction of a Mile and bequeath to my Nephew
 son Thomas Bodley one hundred Dollars as a mark of my esteem for his friendship
 and affection, also one hundred Dollars equally between his wife and Children -
 My my Wife and child to be a good one which I have direct. money to be paid
 to Interest. It shall be done by my Executors and the least to be punctually paid and
 have herein directed and I hope that my Executors will require good and sufficient security
 for the payment of both principal and Interest. And lastly I do hereby nominate
 constitute and appoint my friend John Postker, and my friend Thomas Bodley
 Executors of this my last Will and Testament. I further give and bequeath to
 Isaac Griffith son of Isaac and Elizabeth Griffith fifty Dollars to be paid to be paid
 by my Executors, and paid when he attains the age of Twenty one years -
 In Testimony Whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Subscribed my name
 and affixed my Seal this 20th day of July 1819.
