In the name of God amine I John Marshall being weak in
body but of sound mind memory and understanding do hereby
publish and declare this my last will and Testament in manner
and form following to wit I give and bequeath unto my dearly
beloved wife Elizabeth one third part of my estate both real and
personal so far as the law entitles her to it as her right of dower
Then I give and bequeath unto my daughter Jane McCullah
five shillings even and above what I have formerly given my
said daughter. Then I give and bequeath unto my son James
one black face horse called and known by the name of my sons
sons horse. Then I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph one
black face colt and red calf called my said sons colt and calf
Then I give and bequeath after my just debts are paid all the
remaining part of my estate whether real or personal including
my wife thirds of the land after her death to be equally
divided among my six children to wit my son James my
daughters Elizabeth Margaret Sarah and Mary and my son
Joseph to them their heirs and assigns forever I do hereby nominate
and appoint my wife Elizabeth Marshall and my friends
William Barber and Robert Wilson executors of this my last
will and Testament revoking all former will or wills heretofore
made by me In witness whereunto I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this sixth day of July 1803

to be his last will and testament in the
presence of us who have hereunto subscribed
our names as witnesses and were the
presence of each other

personal estate after payment of my just debts and the remainder to
be equally divided among my three daughters Margaret Mary
and Kitty excepting her portions to me and my wife
