I give and devise one hundred and seventy two acres and one
hundred pole apart of the aforesaid tract on Elkhorn which is
called the house place, also one hundred acres on Bear creek
if that land shall be got, but if not the same quantity within
to have and to hold to him and his heirs and assigns forever, and
to my son Benjamin and his heirs and assigns forever.

I give and devise two hundred acres on the waters of Grays run
whereon he now lives also one hundred acres on North Landing
son Joseph and to his heirs and assigns forever, the remainder
of any lands on Elkhorn, that one hundred and fifty acres
which has been laid off to him, also one hundred acres on the
waters of Raven creek. I also give and devise to my daughter
each of my daughters to their heirs and assigns forever, two hundred
and forty acres on Bear Creek and it is my will that if there should remain
to me any more land other than ^{what} is hereby disposed of, that it
shall be equally divided among my children, and lastly I do
hereby appoint my wife Rachel ^{John} and my son Jacob, as the execu-
tors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all for-
mer wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this 28th day of March in the year of our Lord
one thousand seven hundred and ninety two.

and nature soever, I give and bequeath to my two above mentioned
sons, to be equally divided between them, In witness whereof I

publishable and declared by the above named Susannah
Foyerson to be her last will and testament in the presence
of us who have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses
in the presence of the testator
