

his death to share equally between his children I likewise give and bequeath to said Sophia Blay five hundred Dollars out of the debt due by David Boop for the purchase of Porter Blays shop in December and which has been appoyed to me in pursuance of fulfillment of an agreement which I have entered into with Porter Blay which said sum of five hundred Dollars I do vest in my Executors in trust to the same use & purposes as the aforesaid moiety of my portion of my Fathers estate is vested in them, and do authorize and empower my said Executors whenever the Trust hereby created in favour of Sophia Blay and her children shall become inconvenient or unpleasant to them, to transfer the same to such person or persons as they shall deem suitable. I give and bequeath to my Mother Annina Hart Two hundred Dollars for annuity along as she lives to be paid to her out of the profits of my estate. I will and direct that my Executors shall quote my Brother Nathaniel S Hart, if he continues to pursue the exprombing business in which he is at present engaged a preference in the renting of my work and the hiring of any of my hands which my Executors may think proper to hire out, and furthermore after the payment of my debts, I direct that if there be any money to be put out at interest that a sum not exceeding three thousand Dollars be loaned to my said Brother at legal interest for such time as may be consistent with the intention of my will, he either of the cases aforesaid however my Executors are to take such security as they may deem good for the payment of the hire or rent & money to be advanced to him as aforesaid, having made an advance to my Brother of a considerable proportion of his capital in the stock of Nath Barton Hart, I do remit the interest upon the sum so advanced to my said Brother as long as the said sum has been in business or may continue and direct that no charge therefor be made against him. I do manumit set free and discharge from servitude my negro man Joe on account of his honesty and fidelity to me, and I do give & bequeath to him two hundred Dollars, to assist him in purchasing his wife. Should a controversy existing between Ann Taylor & me relative to Joe terminate unfavorably to my claim, and should my Executors in consequence of their recovery of him obtain any thing from the estate of Phillip Schuyler, I direct that my Executors

do apply the same or so much thereof as may be necessary to the purchase of an annuity of two according to law. I authorize my Executors, to sell and convey or auction and at such times as they may deem proper for the interest of my estate the following property to wit: the tract of land I purchased of William A. Booth in English town, lying on the border of South Elkhorn containing about one thousand acres, the lot on which the old rope Walk is situated which I purchased of Charles Wilking and one acre of land adjoining Foulay Madson and Mrs. Russell, and conveyed by him to me: the house and lot adjoining Thomas Wilking on main street which I purchased of Charles Humphrey: my interest ^{being} including five paths of Twelve hundred acres of land including the Long creek salt works which I purchased of Outlaw; and also my half of one thousand acre of land including the salt pit on Rock Bottom purchased of Tencaid. And should any ^{title} to the said property or any of it be incomplete, I authorize and empower my Executors in their names to demand and receive perfect conveyance. I will and direct that the whole of my estate not here specially devised or bequeathed away, shall be equally divided between my wife Eleanor Hart and my children Thomas (Hart) Eleanor Hart, Lucretia & John Hart them and thore alike to be held and enjoyed by each in fee simple, and in case of the death of either of my children before he or she shall have received his or her part of my estate, the proportion of said deceased child is to be divided between my surviving children. He is my will and intention and I declare that the provision I do hereby make for my wife is in bar of her dower third or any other law she could have upon my estate. I will and direct that no division of my estate shall take place until either the marriage of my wife or the arrival at full age of one of my children in the mean time I direct that my Executors do rent out such portions of my real estate as they may not sell, and hire out my slaves and send in some money institution or place and at interest whatever money may be left belonging to my estate after payment of my debts & specific legacies. And I do will and direct that my Executors apply the whole profits of my estate to the maintenance of my wife & support and education of my children, if it should be required by my wife when wishes whilst she continues unmarried, I wish exclusively to govern my Executors in the disposition of the same. Thomas Hart of Lexington in the State of Kentucky do make ordain and publish this following as and for my last will and testament, I direct that all my just debts be paid, and support & appropriate, for the complete benefit of this object the following assents, to wit; acceptances which I have lately made for Harb Bartlett Esq. of New Orleans to the amount of about twenty thousand Dollars, and which they are to reimburse me, the proceeds of shipment of cargo, and some few other articles which I have made this Spring to New Orleans by Abbot Barton & Buckley and which ought to produce at least twenty one thousand Dollars, my stock of hump on hand and which is to be furnished by those who have contracts to supply me all of which will be manufactured by October or November next, estimated at fifteen thousand Dollars, and my cash on hand amounting to about thirteen thousand Dollars, should the funds from any cause prove inadequate to the discharge of my debts, I direct that the deficit be made up out of my capital employed in trade either at this place in the form of Bart Barton (Hart) or at New Orleans in the form of Hart, Bartlett and Co. I do hereby authorize and empower my Executors to continue to carry on business under either or both of the forms of Harb Barton & Hart of Lexington and Harb Bartlett Esq. of New Orleans for the periods fixed for the duration of these forms respectively, in the same manner as I myself could do were I living but I desire, and accordingly direct that the continuance of the said forms or either of them be left to the option of the surviving partners thereof, and that if the surviving partners of either firm wish it to cease that such firm shall terminate accordingly, I desire and bequeath to my Sister Lucyanna Price and to Sophia Lloy wife of Porter Lloy whatever portion of the estate of my Father real or personal, I may now or hereafter be entitled to receive to be equally divided between them, should and their heirs subject to a deduction notwithstanding of four hundred Dollars which I have agreed with Robert Lewis to purchase him a vessel for with the Executors of my Father for a negro I purchased of him. But the moiety of Sophia Lloy I do vest in my Executors in trust that they may apply the same to her support and maintenance and that of her children & that of her

 Father may think will be for the most advantage for him & give unto my wife
 Elizabeth during her life the whole of the tract of land on which I live with
 every of its appurtenances and after her death to be sold and the money arising

 children it is my will that all the rest of my lands in the state or out of the
 it shall be sold that is my right only and the money arising from the
