 memory do bequeath as follows 1<sup>st</sup> I give the fourth  
 to my wife and the following property with a negro woman  
 named Peggy & a negro man named Guy with and  
 such furniture as she may think necessary for her  
 self and the use of the children also a horse and saddle  
 such as she may choose of the present ones on hand  
 at the time and with one third of the income of my  
 estate during her natural life. It is my will that all  
 my just debts be paid I leave and bequeath as follows:

The use of my farm on the State Court road to be for the  
 support of my wife and Children during her life in which  
 I wish them to live. It is my will and pleasure that my  
 lot of land said to be thirty five acres on the Town Station road  
 being part of John Hamwells survey and adjoining Robert  
 Campbell lot and James Trotters farm between my out lot  
 opposite William Mortons garden on the direct road to the  
 North End side of this town also my out lot adjoining James  
 Mores north of Huberts road also my out lot on the East of Huberts road  
 and opposite Patrick McCulloughs lot also my lot on the East

In the name of God Amen I Conrad Sidener of  
 the County of Fayette and State of Kentucky being advanced in  
 years & infirm in body yet of a sound mind and desiring  
 to settle to mind the mortality of all men, do make certain  
 this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows  
 hereby revoking any former will or bequest hitherto by me made  
 First I bequeath my soul to God who gave it, my body to be decently  
 buried in a christianlike manner Secondly I give and bequeath  
 to my beloved wife Margaret Sidener one thousand Dollars in current  
 money during her widowhood, and if any of the said thousand Dollars  
 be left and remaining after such period, it is to be divided as my other  
 property and effects are - I also give to my said wife Margaret one  
 horse two cows two sheep one brood sow and six barrows of her own  
 choice, and as much of the corn wheat rye and oats as will be suf-  
 ficient to answer the purpose of feeding the stock and breeding the  
 family as well her self after my decease for the term of one year from  
 such decease, also her bridle, saddle, and as much of my household  
 furniture as will be in her opinion amply sufficient to subsist on  
 during her said widowhood, and a negro woman, I also bequeath that  
 my said wife shall have built at the expence of my Executors hereof  
 two named a log house hewed inside and outside on the lot of land  
 where I now live, and further all that part of the land included in  
 said lot, which lies between the lots laid out for Henry & Conrad Sidener  
 to be included by a line drawn from the North Eastwardly corner of  
 Conrad Sidener's tract, running South eastward by the same course of  
 S. Conrads line until it intersects the line of Henry Sidener - I also  
 enjoin on my Executors to have the house finished in the following  
 manner, a stone chimney, a shingled roof and other joiners work so  
 as to make a comfortable dwelling house sixteen feet by twenty,  
 I also desire that my said wife may enjoy and have at her disposal  
 during widowhood the above named property - I do also bequeath  
 that there shall be laid off in a new form, half an acre of land
