Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Christian Pool the use and Cultivation of all my estates as well that above mentioned as that yet to mention during her natural life such part as she shall think suit her best and after my wife's death all my estates as above mentioned as above Household furniture stocks and negroes to be sold and after the cash legacies are paid as above my will and desire is and I do give and bequeath the monies arising from said sale to be equally divided between my son Ezekiel Pool John Pool Samuel Pool and Philip Pool. Item I leave and appoint my loving wife Christian Pool and my son William Pool my executors to this my last will and testament renouncing all others and owning this and only this. Item I give to my daughter Lucy Wortham two negroes named Tuck and Lemah to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my daughter Francis part of one negro woman named Melley to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever but if she should die without such heir then for it to be equally divided amongst my surviving children. Item I give to my daughter Phoebe Pemberton one negro girl named Esther one feather bed and furniture and twenty pounds cash to be paid by Fanny out of her part to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my daughter Fanny Boulware two negroes named Bob and Blah and one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my grandson Hiram Wortham two negroes named Charlotte and Roy to him and his heirs forever. Item my will and desire is that if either of my children should die without lawful heir that their part should be equally divided between the surviving heirs. Item I give to my beloved wife Ruthie Boulware two big bay horses and one saddle one feather bed and furniture and one large chest to her and her heirs forever. Item I send to my wife Ruthie Boulware two negroes named Sall and Solomon during her natural life and at her death for them and monies to be equally divided between my daughter Phoebe Pemberton and Fanny Boulware to them and their heirs forever. Item my will and desire is that all the lands belonging to me in this state be equally divided between my three sons John
