In the name of God Amen I William Boyce of the County of Fayette and State of
 Kentucky being now in disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this to be my
 last Will and Testament. I here declare that my Son in Law James Wilson
 Blanky Hoag and Henry Means that married my daughters Betsey Saleny and
 Nancy have already received each and properly the several sum of what I have
 given them as their portion of my Estate - I wish it clearly understood that the property
 and money above alluded to as the portion received by Henry Means only being
 such as was received prior to the 20th day of March Eighteen Hundred and Seven
 (it being about the time of the commencement of my removal to this County) and also
 that he has received since that date was as agent and not as executor except
 two negroes named Hector and Tommy received 13th June 1808 - As my Estate
 lies in various parts of the world and of various descriptions of property do that
 I cannot make equal distribution in my Will among the rest of my Children
 who have not received their portions by spending out of each their share of
 property in Order to be equal Justice to them and my Loving wife I give and
 bequeath every part of my Estate of every kind a balance to be equally divided
 by Sale or otherwise among said last Wife between my Loving Wife and my
 Children notwithstanding and their heirs for ever having particular
 regard to the education of my Children who yet to be educated - I constitute
 ordain and appoint my Loving wife Elizabeth with my Executors my Sons
 John and William and Thomas Means my Son in Law the whole and
 Sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament In Case Thomas
 Means should serve as an Executor after the decease of my Estate is
 settled and upon his rendering of an account and part of what of his proceedings
 that in my will he should be amply compensated for his trouble

- To William Boyce Lot No. 1. Comprising 100 Acres and site, valued to \$400. the said William paying said Debt and Co. Sec. \$100.00 and William Boyce \$300.00.
- To Darius Boyce Lot No. 4. Comprising 100 Acres and site, valued to \$900. the said Darius paying said Debt and Co. Sec. \$225.00 and Darius Boyce \$675.00.
- To Gundy Boyce Lot No. 5. Comprising 100 Acres and site, valued to \$880. the said Gundy paying said Debt and Co. Sec. \$220.00 and Gundy Boyce \$660.00.
