

In the name of God. I, Richard Young Son of Fayette County, State of Kentucky, being Weak in Body, lent of Sound and disposing mind and willing to make and declare this my last Will and Testament in a Manner and form as follows: viz. I do hereby bequeath into the hands of the Heavenly and Merciful God that gave me and my Body, body and soul, to be buried in a Decent Manner by my Executor herein after here named. It is my Will and Desire that all my Just Debts be paid, Satisfaction to a Debt of Ten pounds being due to John Young be paid at my Decease. I will and bequeath to my three unmarried Daughters, Mary Young, Susan Young and Lucy Young, One Negro named Phil and the money arising from the Sale of the Land I now Live on which I lately sold to James Dick for one Hundred Dollars, and also my Stock of Horses, Cattle, Sheep and Hogs, my farming Utensils, tools and kitchen furniture and every other kind of property both move and personal of which I may be possessed at the time of my Death, and I desire that all the other of them shall remain the estate to furnish them with apparel and furniture and all the other of the value of Sixty Dollars - and I desire the natural life of my unmarried Daughters shall be paid and all the property that then remains shall be equally divided between my Children except my Son William Young who by his Agency in my Estate has had his just proportion already, and I desire the Daughters of my Daughter Susan shall have a Child's proportion of my Estate with my other Children to have and their Heirs for ever. Lastly I constitute and appoint my Executor Richd. Young of Fayette County my Executor, and my Daughters Mary Young and Lucy Young my Co-executors of this my last Will and Testament with express authority to make James Dick as Deed for the Land being about forty acres) whereas I now Live if it remains undivided at my Decease. It is my Will and Desire that my Executor and Co-executors be admitted to act without giving Security and without having the Estate appraised, thereby making all other things by me made and confirming this only as my last Will and Testament. I know Mr Men by their presents that I William Dringefield of the County of Fayette and Commonwealth of Kentucky, considering the uncertainty of this life and being of Sound and perfect health and memory, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, in the Manner and form following: To wit:
 1st It is my Will that all my Just debts be punctually paid and discharged as soon as the same can conveniently be done -
 2nd It is my Will that all the estate of which I may be possessed at the time of my Death, after the discharge of all my just Debts as aforesaid, also all the land and property of every description which I am now entitled to at the death of my Mother Mary Dringefield Henry Wife and Legitimate Son of Brother Henry Dringefield of the County of Frederick and State of Virginia - Lastly I appoint my Brother John Dringefield of the aforesaid County and State, Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby making and signing these my last Will and Testament, this 4th day of June 1812, W. Dringefield (Seal)
