horse & Pleasure to her for the benefit of her lawful
heirs Not to be disposed of to or by any persons
whatsoever Thirdly I Will and bequeath unto My
daughter Rebecca Taylor One Negro Girl Named
Hagan and One Feather Bed & Furniture One
horse & Saddle One Pleasure Fourthly I Will and
bequeath unto My daughter Sarah Taylor One
Negro Girl Named Amanda One Feather Bed
& Furniture One horse & Saddle One Pleasure each
One of those My last three above named Daughters
shall have a peaceable home with My son
John L. Taylor until they marry then each One
shall have the Negro above willed & property be-
queathed unto them & the 2/3 Negroes brought off
then should be any before the several Marriages
of My Daughters and all the Movable property
not above willed with a peaceable home with
My son John L. Taylor Fifthly I Will & bequeath
unto My beloved wife Hannah Taylor three Negroes
Named Santee Primer & Milley & their increase
during her widowhood & at her death or Marrying
to be divided Equally amongst My son & Daughters
Elizabeth Rebecca & Sarah Taylors also My
Stock of all kind Horses & Tools and all remaining
property to the disposal of My wife Hannah
