I Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Margaret Ross my love and also all the tackling that appertains or belongs to said loom and also give unto my said daughter Margaret Ross Forty Dollars and also it is my will that my said daughter Margaret Ross and my other children to wit Mary, Daniel, Elizabeth <sup>Thomas</sup> Williams Emily and John Babineau Ross receive to the value of whatever I have given to my daughter Anne Hally exclusive of the loom and tackling with the Forty Dollars which I first willed to my daughter Margaret Ross. It is further my will that all my personal property be sold by my Executors hereafter to be named and after paying as above bequeathed to be equally divided amongst the whole of my children. This personal property not to include the loom and tackling, bequeathed to my daughter Margaret Ross. It is further my desire that the tract of land whereon I now live be rented by my Executors as above until my Executors may think proper to sell the said tract or part of a tract of land which it is my will they should do within five years after my decease and out of the money or monies arising therefrom after all the former part of this my will <sup>has</sup> been complied with, should the sale of my personal property not be sufficient and also the sum of Twenty Dollars to my daughter Emily and also the sum of Forty Dollars to each of my three sons - William, Thomas and John Babineau to be appropriated by my said Executors for the support and education of my said daughter and my said three sons, then it is my desire that all of the remainder of my estate be equally divided among the whole of my children. I do hereby nominate and appoint my friends Samuel Patterson and Robert Wilson Executors of this my last will and testament revoking all former wills or Wills by me made heretofore made by me. And it is my desire that my four sons Daniel William Thomas & John Babineau be bound to give trades as they respectively arrive to the age of fifteen years in testimony
