and then have any she like to have out of my stock and all my hogs & sheep and two litter hicks with all their furniture of every kind and the weaving looms with all the with all the articles that belong to it to make it fit for use and one two horse plow and one one horse plow and they to be put in good order for work and the two pt of hew chains all to be put in good order for work & my Copper Stove that I own and all the hows held Kitchen furniture of every kind and all castings and parts and two good falling axes and two good broad hays and one grubbing hoe and two good hew Weggs & one set of iron bands for a mill and the black waggon all to be put in good order for work & all the small tools augers drawing knives saw and Chisells and such like and two hundred dollars in bank as soon as it can be raised from men of Oradel, that show their note for two hundred dollars and all the cash I have in my house at my departure, with or much less than I give and bequeath to our son Samuel Barter one negro man named Tob and one negro boy named Harry and one hundred dollars in bank out of the above note, then I give and bequeath to our son Thomas Barter one negro man named Charles and one negro girl named Frank and one negro boy named Anthony & one hundred dollars in bank out of the above note and all my rehearing apparel abroad of all sorts, then I give and bequeath to our daughter Sarah Jones one negro man named She and one negro girl named Stane and one child named Petty during her life time and if she out live her to any of her children she may proper and one hundred dollars in bank out of the note above mentioned and one litter hick and all furniture belonging to it, the best goose by the name of John Reed then I give and bequeath our daughter Rebecca Smith one negro woman named Cande and one negro boy named buff and one negro girl named both silver and one hundred dollars in bank out of the note spoken of during her

her life and if the negro live longer than her to any of her children she may proper. then my land I give to my son Thomas Barter and my daughter Rebecca Smith to be divided by a line to begin at a large tree in the garden agrove tree of a small piece of land I purchase of Samuel M Brookly to run a line south all it comes into the branch we crop to go to King Grays and after said branch to where it crosses line between me and Mr George Vanningham and all the land West of that line and the South side of the branch I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Barter and all the remain I will and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Smith during her life time and at her death to any of her children she may proper. then as for my Copper Smith tool I will and bequeath to my son Thomas Samuel Barter to be equally divided except the large Pench Vice and that I give to my son Thomas Barter. then I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Barter the mill that is in the shop not made up and all the Copper of all sorts, then and for the remaining part of my estate that is not spoken of in this will of all things that is to collected I will and bequeath one third part of it to my living wife Rebecca Barter and the remaining part of it to be equally divided between our four children Samuel Barter Thomas Barter Sarah Jones Rebecca Smith, and by mistake the negro girl left to my daughter Rebecca Smith is entailed, and I do will and bequeath the said negro girl to my daughter Rebecca Smith, and any part of the estate such as the negro or any other part whatsoever at my death to be equally divided between our four children Samuel Barter Thomas Barter Sarah Jones Rebecca Smith, and I do hereby nominate and appoint my sons Samuel Barter Thomas Barter and Greenberry Smith my whole and sole Executors of this my last will
