and calling to mind that is appointed for all men
to die to first of all recommend my spirit to

Secondly I do dispose of my worldly goods and
chattels of which it has pleased God to bless me with
in the following manner, but first I do direct that
my well beloved wife Rebecca Burham shall retain
and keep ⁱⁿ her possession during the time of her living
widow all personal goods & chattels that is first

of horses, seven head of neat cattle, four head
of sheep, thirty five head of hogs, three yoke
of horse gears together with all my ^{farm}
ing utensils and all my house hold stuff and
furniture. Thirdly all my farms with all the appurtenances
thereunto belonging I do direct that my wife Rebecca
shall remain in full possession of my mansion
house with full possession thereof during the time of her
being my widow and at the expiration of the
same all my lands and tenements shall be equally
divided between my sons Hamilton, Zedekiah Martin
& Amos Sidney and the one half of my personal
estate to be equally divided ^{between} the said four sons, Hamilton
Zedekiah, Martin, Amos and Sidney and the other
half of my personal estate to be equally divided
between my my three daughters Polly, Dilsey
and Betsey, and do direct that my executor
shall pay over to my eldest son London Burham
the sum of one dollar current money of this state.
And on a mutual agreement between myself
and my wife Rebecca it is agreed on that at the ex-
piration of her being no more my widow my widow
she shall not have the power to dispose of or bequeath
any part or article of any of my goods, chattels
or tenements whatever but shall relinquish the same
into the hands of my executor and it is further
understood that my wife Rebecca shall not have
any part in the administration of my worldly
estate but shall resign the same to my executor
in full. I do nominate and appoint my friend
Wm. Wilson of Fleming County my lawful attorney
and Mrs. Davis my executor, for me and my name
at the same time making null and void all wills

and testaments heretofore made or done by me at the same time confirming this my last will and testament signed under my hands and seal this 2nd day of July 1822 signed sealed and delivered in presence of Summariah Boutwell
