

to my son Benjamin I give One Hundred acres
of Land adjoining to the Brother Joshua
situated near the Two Hundred Acres above
Directed to be laid off on the upper End
of the five hundred acres I now live on,
on the water of a Creek to begin at
a big Peachtree (The Beginning of the whole
Survey of One Thousand Acres of Land) and
extending Eastward for quantity, provided
also that my Two Sons above said Joshua and
Benjamin are to Divide the two Hundred
Acres of Land themselves. (If they should
not Agree then in such case the Division
of the Land shall be made by two or three
good and honest men of this County
(of their choice) Then I give and Devise
to my Daughter Elizabeth and Anne gone
Two hundred Acres of Land lying & situate below
the two hundred above Directed to Joshua
and Benjamin and Equally to be divided
between them by Joshua and Benjamin
above said to them and their heirs or
Assigns forever. Then I Give and Bequeath
whatever profits may arise from my Farm
when I shall live with the Live stock of my
Slave property and stock with my house
hold Furniture and Farming Utensils
after the Decease of my wife Sarah gone
to be Equally Divided among my five
Children above named.

And whereas my son Thomas gone at this
time Dwells or not in his proper Reason
I think it my Duty to add that the Land
and Property above Directed to him
shall be under the Control of his two brothers

Joshua and Benjamin and the profits arising therefrom
to be applied to his use and benefit & they may think
best and also that he shall not have the power to
dispose of any thing Directed to him in the premises
until he be of the proper age and shall
Recover his Reason and appear capable of doing his
own business - At which Time I give the Land and
property Directed to him by this Will and the profits
arising therefrom shall be in his own power to be
disposed of as he may choose.

And Lastly I nominate constitute and appoint my
Two Sons Joshua and Benjamin gone whole and sole
Executors of this my last will and Testament and
whereas I have a considerable sum of money due to
me in Baltimore County and State of Maryland
My will is & I Order that after my last Debts are
paid and my Funeral expenses defrayed the
Remainder of the same be Equally Divided among
my five Children above named.
