

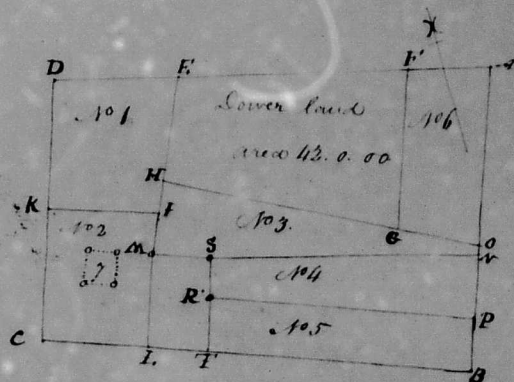

In pursuance of an order of the County Court of Shering appointing us the undersubscribed commissioners to assign to Mary Thomas her division

in the lands of Jeremiah Proctor and his heirs first shown we on the 17<sup>th</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> & 21<sup>st</sup> of March 1822 have first ascertained that the lands of the late Jeremiah Proctor deceased whereon the said Mary Thomas now lives contains one hundred and sixty seven and one half acres and is represented by the lines A. B. C. D. we then assigned to the said Mary forty two acres which is bounded as follows beginning at D a stake in Widow Thredkell's line thence with her line S. 76° E 109 poles to F a white oak and sugar tree thence S 20° W 79 1/2 poles to G a hickory elm & black oak. Thence N 63 1/2 W no poles to H a stake in the road passing the horse mill on said farm thence N 25° E 48 1/2 poles to the beginning including the dwelling house and horse mill.

We then divided the balance of the above 16 1/2 acres being the remainder after the above described 42 acres and about 8 1/2 acres claimed by Lucius Chapman, s<sup>r</sup> is taken from it between the heirs of the late Jeremiah Proctor dec.

that is we allot to Levi Thomas and (Dorinda) his wife late Dorinda Proctor dec. No 1 containing twenty acres and bounded as follows beginning at D a large Red oak a sugar tree comes to said 16 1/2 acres in Widow Thredkell's line thence with her line S 76° E 58 1/2 poles to L a stake comes to Mary Thomas 42 acres thence with the same and passing the corner thereof S 25° E 48 1/2 poles to F a stake thence N 70° E 52 1/2 poles to H a stake oak and hickory in the west boundary of the of 42 1/2 acres thence with the same N 19 1/2° E 59 1/2 poles to the beginning.

to lot No 3 thence with a line thence of N 63 $\frac{1}{2}$   
W 40 $\frac{1}{2}$  poles to G a stake hickory, elm, and  
black oak corner to the widow's land thence  
with the same N 28 $\frac{1}{2}$  W 73 $\frac{1}{2}$  poles to I a white oak  
and sugar tree north east corner of the  
widow's corner thence S 16 $\frac{1}{2}$  E 40 $\frac{1}{2}$  poles to the begin-  
ning containing twenty acres. — Small plat in  
drawn lines around R is a lot of ground claimed  
by Chapen on which he lives and contains about  
7 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres. And small plat around figure 7 is  
a lot claimed by Chapen containing about one  
acre said lot is not estimated in the foregoing  
division and when taken from the aforesaid  
16 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres leaves one hundred and fifty nine acres  
that we have divided by the foregoing report
