that is to say I hereby appoint my beloved wife Mary McCorkle executrix of this my last will and testament. 2^d I will and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be as speedily paid as possible after my decease out of my estate. 3^d I will & bequeath to my loving wife Mary McCorkle the plantation that I now live on to her proper use and behoof to sell convey or lease as she may think best and all my personal property after my just debts is paid except such as is hereinafter named. 4th I will and bequeath to my son William McCorkle one sword mare colt one gun old and saddle and my rifle gun 5th I will and bequeath to my daughter Patsy McCorkle and Jane Nancy and Rebecca & Margaret McCorkle my daughters two dollars each
