 County and State of Kentucky being weak and sick in
 body but of perfect mind and memory thanks
 be to God calling to mind the mortality of my body
 and knowing it is appointed for all men once to
 die do make and ordain this my last will and
 testament that is to say first I principally of
 all I recommend my soul into the hands of almighty
 God who gave it and my body I recommend to
 the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial
 nothing doubting but what I shall receive the same
 at the General resurrection by the mighty power of God
 And as touching such worldly estate as it hath been
 pleased God to bless me with in this life I give
 dispose & bequeath of in the following manner
 First I give and bequeath to my beloved
 wife the plantation I now live on together with
 all my moveable estate, and at her decease the
 whole to belong to my two youngest sons Robert
 and Solomon - I give and bequeath to my son
 John Collins one hundred dollars to be paid
 when collected by my Executors - I give and bequeath
 unto my son Martin hims fifty dollars to be
 paid when collected as aforesaid - I give & bequeath
 to my daughter Mary fifty dollars to be paid
 when collected as aforesaid - I give & bequeath unto my
 daughter Sarah fifty dollars to be paid when collected as aforesaid

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha fifty dollars to be paid when collected as aforesaid.

I give and bequeath unto my son James two hundred dollars to be paid as aforesaid.

I give and bequeath to my son Thomas one dollar. I give & bequeath to my son William one hundred

dollar to be paid when collected by my Executors.

And I do hereby utter, revoke and revoke all other former testament, wills, legacies, bequests, Executors by me in any wise before or since with bequests ratifying & confirming this and no other to be my last will & Testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the thirtieth day of January eighteen hundred & seventeen
