properly therefore I will that James S. Magawen be charged with the sum three hundred and fifty seven pounds current Money then advanced to him that Abraham Magawen be charged with the sum of three hundred pounds current money advanced to him. That my son Henry Magawen be charged with the sum of twenty nine pounds four shillings current money including the value of negro Mabel now in his possession and advanced to him and that my son Abraham Magawen be charged with the sum of one hundred and seventy one pounds seventeen shillings current money including the value of negro Mary now in his possession advanced to him. Item I will and begeth unto my grand daughter Phoebe Stone a negro girl named Sarah also to my grand daughter Susan Stone a negro girl named Merna both daughters of negro Cue. Item it is my will and I appoint John Dore trustee to my daughter Nancy Stone in and of my Estate to receive profits and hold the same in trust for her use and until she be the usual profits thereof during her natural life and at her decease deliver the said dividends to her heirs. Item it is my will and I do appoint such parties as Trustee to my daughter Rachel Magawen's share of my estate to receive profits and hold the same during the natural life of my said daughter and render unto her the usual profits thereof and at her decease to deliver the said dividends to her heirs.
