Sences and memory calling to mind the Mortality of Mankind
do make this my last will and testament in manner and
form following to wit I give unto my son Noah 137 acres
of Land which I give the one half because he is my son the other
half by paying 110 dollars paying interest from this date which
money I want appropriated to the use of Schooling my little
Chililing. N.B. I give the whole record on this to Noah Wright
but if the land is lost no recourse on my heirs, my other lands

to be divided equal quantity and quality improved and unimproved Between Isa and Noble Both alike which to be kept in their Mothers hands until her death and every thing else of property kind, Adah h^d got twenty four dollars dollars worth of property the rest from oldest to youngest of the girls to be made up as much and at their mothers death all the Household furniture and Stock to be equally divided amongst them the farming utensills to be divided between Isa and Noble my wife has to make a deed to James Alexander according to the Bond that Daughter give not to come nigher than twenty rods of the road to include all his old improvement the deed to be made at Alexander's Cost entirely as I never rec'd anything for it She has to collect my money due and pay my debts out of it departed April the fourth 1814

James Wright's last will and Testament made in the presence of Thomas Kincaid and Charles Harper

Personally appeared before me one of the Commonwealth's Justices of peace for Fleming County, Thomas Kincaid & Charles Harper both of full age and just duly sworn saith the within will was made by the direction of the within Testator James Wright about 24 or 30 hours before his death & that he was in his perfect senses & further he declared that it should be his Will in case he then died and directed said Kincaid to put his name to the same after his death and that the will was signed by them before the death of the Testator as witnesses & further sayeth not whereunto they have affix their hands and seals this 7th Novr 1814
