of Benjamin D. Bell dec'd of Fleming County who the
undersigned subscribers being called upon by said
Benjamin on the 2nd day of the instant at night
particularly charged to take notice that he the said
Benjamin did give and bequeath unto William
Fleming his nephew two hundred dollars to be paid
to him by John D. Bell Executor of William D. Bell
dec'd Father of said Benjamin as soon as he should
be made or raised out of said Benjamin D. Bell's part
or interest in his father's estate It is to be understood
that said Benjamin D. Bell had considerable property
bequeathed to him by his father which property had
not yet come into his hands possession out of which
the two hundred had to be paid the first money that
could be raised the said Benjamin made no dispo-
sition of any other part of his interest or share of
his father's estate to our knowledge which was
made on the 6th day of April 1818 this request was
made in his last sickness about three days before he
died at his mother's where he then resided and had
done for between five and six months and he died the
5th day of April 1818 and this statement was reduced
to writing the day it began date
