and being at this time of sound judgement &
perfect mind and memory do make this following
my last will and testament (This)

Item 1st After all my just debts and funeral
expences are paid, I do hereby will & bequeath
to my daughter Nancy one feather bed and
furniture are now and the room she at present
dwells in together with the clothing therein to
belonging. Item 2nd I do hereby will & bequeath
to my son Amos the feather bed and furniture
thereunto belonging which he at present occupies
Item 3rd I do furthermore will & bequeath
to my loving wife Deborah all my land and
also all my stock and household furniture
after the above legacies are paid as also
all money owing to me and all goods
and property of every description that I
have any right or claim to at my decease
so as to fully comprehend the whole of my
estate during her natural life and at
her decease it is my will and desire that
after she disposes of her third part of
my personal estate in such manner and
form as she shall think best that then
the residue and remainder of my personal

as well as my land, shall be sold and the proceeds
thereof equally divided between my four children
Wm James & Isaac Pilla & Nancy with the following
exceptions (This) That in case my wife Deborah should
think proper to marry after my decease then and
in that case it is my will that after having to my
wife Deborah the third part of my personal estate
that the remaining two thirds shall be sold and
equally divided amongst my four children James
Amos Pilla & Nancy and in case of the marriage
of my wife Deborah it is my will that the two thirds
of my land shall be sold and the proceeds thereof
Equally divided among my four children James
Amos Pilla & Nancy, and lastly at the decease of
my wife Deborah that the remaining third of my
land shall be sold and the proceeds thereof equally
divided between my four children Wm James & Isaac
Pilla & Nancy And furthermore I do constitute
Richard Wood Robert Harper and my wife Deborah
as my executors to see that this my last will and
testament shall be duly executed according to the
full intention and meaning thereof In witness
whereof I do hereby publish and ordain this my last
will & testament hereby revoking all former wills &
bequests or legacies made or done by me, and solely
acknowledging this and no other as my last will and
testament this 15th day of January in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred & fourteen

 set my hand and seal this 4th day of August 1819
