In the name of God Amen

I John Constant of Fleming County and State of Kentucky
 being infirm in body but of disposing memory, calling to mind
 the mortality of the body and that I must appear to the Court
 of natural shortly and that a proper disposition of the same
 parts and chattels with which it has pleased the Almighty to bless me
 in this life may be made and done, Do hereby make such
 disposition in the following Manner:

First I will that my just debts and funeral charges be paid
 paid out of the proceeds of a sale of each part of my personal estate
 as may be sufficient for that purpose in the discretion of my Executors

Then I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Constant all
 the residue of my personal estate after the deductions in this my
 will specified to have and use same for her own goods and chattels
 during her natural life or reputable duration as a widow, and
 immediately upon her reputation being justly furnished future
 marriage or natural death whichever of them may first
 happen, then such estate to descend to, and rest in my two children
 by me the said Elizabeth, to wit, John Constant and Maria Constant,
 to be equally divided between them, I reserve unto them the right to
 claim their two and a half acres of land, but subject nevertheless to
 the further directions herein after mentioned to wit, Within
 one year after my decease (whether the legacy above bequeathed
 may then be in the hands of the said Elizabeth or those of my
 children aforesaid) I will that my Executors hereinafter
 named do pay the sum of Twenty five cents to each of my children
 by my former wife to wit, Isaac Constant, Jacob Constant,
 Martha Morgan, Mary Kelly, Sarah Sargent, Ruth Shover
 and Ann Newcomb, that sum to each of them as may be
 being at the time above mentioned for payment things
 then I will and do give to my aforesaid son John Constant
 a tract of land containing one hundred and fifty acres
 lying in the County of Fleming aforesaid on the waters of

901 both Fleming and Liebling River being that I purchased of Gen^l William Henry, out of General Henry to hold to him his heir and assigns forever. Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Constant and John Cooley Executors and Executors of this my Last Will and Testament. Hereby revoking all former and other Wills by me made.
