that is to say I hereby appoint my beloved wife Mary McCorkle executrix of this my last will and testament. 2^d I will and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be as speedily paid as possible after my decease out of my estate. 3^d I will & bequeath to my loving wife Mary McCorkle the plantation that I now live on to her proper use and behoof to sell convey or lease as she may think best and all my personal property after my just debts is paid except such as is hereinafter named. 4th I will and bequeath to my son William McCorkle one sword mare colt one year old and saddle and my rifle gun. 5th I will and bequeath to my daughter Patsy McCorkle and Jane Nancy and Rebecca & Margaret McCorkle my daughters two dollars each

492) 6th I will and bequeath to my sons James and John McCorkle two dollars each.

I hereby revoke annul cancel and declare all further wills bequeaths or giving by me made declaring this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 19th day of June 1821.

Lowry's Will

Exam.

In the name of God Amen. I William G. Lowry of Fleming County State of Kentucky being weak in body, but of sound & perfect mind & memory bless be Almighty God for the same do make and publish this my last will & testament in manner & form following (that is to say) first I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Lowry the one half of the several tracts of land on which I live, including the mansion house. Also the following named slaves, Serv

Quey. Isaac, Matilda, Colary & her child (493) Lydia. Esther Dick Hurst, during her natural life, then to be divided equally between myself Geo. G. Lowry & my daughter Eliza B. Lowry. For my son Geo. G. Lowry I give & bequeath one hundred & twenty acres of land to include the place on which Doyle & Shack lived. also the following named slaves. Polly, Fanny, Emory, Sabey, Parak Mark, Mary, Samuel, Issa, Willis, George & Jane also all my part of my father's estate in Virginia equally to his will. Lastly I give & bequeath to my daughter Eliza B. Lowry, the following slaves Charles, Milly, Studak, Rachael, and all the balance of the land of the several tracts on which I reside, which was purchased of Wade Mosby. All my personal estate after all my just debts are paid I divide equally between my wife, my son, & daughter at the time my son becomes of age which will be on the 28th of Decr 1820. a division of the real estate also to take place at the same time. I have my money in silver amounting to about two hundred & fifty dollars, to my son, for the purpose of finishing his medical education. I hereby appoint my son Geo. G. Lowry & my wife Elizabeth Lowry executor & executrix of this my last will & testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal, the 3^d day of Decr. in the year of our Lord 1821. Wm. G. Lowry
