supernatural to be. I have Reason to believe that my wife
Rachel is at this time pregnant in such case I have and
bequeath to such issue the plantation whereon I now live
containing forty acres within such Child or Children shall
be of full age according to law but in case of death of such
Child or Children before age or in case she my wife should
not bear this time pregnant I leave and bequeath as
follows, That is to say I leave and bequeath to my beloved
wife Rachel the above mentioned forty acres of Land to
have and to hold the same from the time of such death
or non pregnancy to her only use and to have the sole

benefit of the same until the said child shall come at the age
above mentioned. Also I leave to my said wife a black two year
old mare now in my possession, also all my stock of swine, also
all my household furniture of every kind with all my farming
utensils. And I do hereby nominate constitute appoint my
beloved friend & Father in Law George Hummer whole & sole Executor
of this my last will and Testament making void & annulling
all wills or wills heretofore made by me Confirming this as
the only to be my last will and Testament, In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this first day of
February one thousand eight hundred and one
