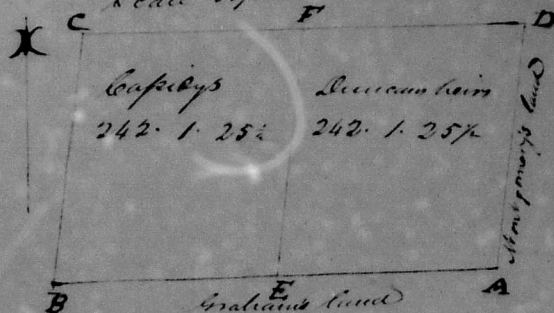

 Survey of land

In obedience to an order of the Honorable the Fleming County Court I proceeded on the 11th of June 1820. in company with Henry Bruce Esquire John David Clerk three of the commission named and the aforesaid order to wit to convey one half of a survey of 440 acres situate to James Deacon deceased to Richard Capekys for the heirs of said Deacon and having first ascertained that

the aforesaid survey of Deacons contains Four hundred eighty four and three fourth acres eleven poles We ran lot to mid Capekys. We measured here and a fourth across 25 poles on the west end of said tract and counted as follows Beginning at E a black oak and a wood in Deacons and Abrahams line South 88° West 175 poles from a Deacons South East corner Thence North 6° East 222 1/2 poles to E a stake in Deacons line Thence with the same South 88° West 175 poles to C a stake in cleared land where a corner of white hickory once stood Deacons corner Thence with the West boundary of Deacons tract South 6° West 222 1/2 poles to B a stake where a black oak and three black oak saplings another of Deacons corner stood Thence with Deacons line North 88° East 175 poles passing Abrahams corner to the Beginning. A.B.C.D represents James Deacons 440 acres
