The Testimony of Mr Ritchie and Rachel Chapman taken before the County Court of Flaming on the 1 day of May Term in the year 1815 to establish the noncupative will said to have been made by Joseph McHenry and so far as regards the disposition of a negro girl named Maria to the said daughter Betsey McHenry she swears that Joseph McHenry died on the 8 day of February last and that on the day preceding his death he informed her of his intentions (leaving her to dispose of his death bed) and at his residence

in the County Flaming) that it was his wish that his daughter Betsey should have negro girl Maria as she was lame & less able to provide for her self than the rest of his children and that it was his wish that his Brother Arden McHenry should manage her estate after his death and further sayeth not
