 of the County of Fluening State of Kentucky being of
 sound mind and memory, but knowing the uncertainty of
 life, do make this my last will and testament hereby
 revoking all former wills or declarations, I commit
 my soul to God who gave it hoping for immortality
 and everlasting happiness ^{my} body to be committed to the
 dust from whence it came. And as to my worldly
 affair make the following disposition thereof. After
 all my just debts are paid I will & bequeath unto
 my beloved wife Mary all my estate both real &
 personal during her life the one half thereof to her
 and her heirs forever the other half at her death
 I give unto my young kinsman Thomas Mauleadingham
 who now lives with me son of Thomas Mauleadingham
 deceased to him and his heirs forever I do nominate &
 appoint my said wife my sole executrix of this my last
 will & testament the writing whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this 4th day of August 1819

In the name of God amen. I James Lewis of the County
of Fleming and State of Kentucky Being thro' the
abundant mercies of God the mark of body apt
of sound ~~reason~~ and perfect understanding
and memory do constitute this my last will
and testament and desire that it may be
received by all as such First I most humbly
request my soul to God my maker hereafter
his most gracious acceptance of it through
the all sufficient merits of my most comfort-
-ing redeemer Jesus Christ as for my burial
I desire it may be decent without pomp
or state at the discretion of my dear wife and
my executor hereafter named as to my worldly
estate I will & positively order that all my
just debts be paid. Next I give to my dear
and loving wife and this part of all my
estate during her natural life I will that
my eldest son Robert A. Lewis his after paying
the ~~two~~ hundred dollars for a negro man named
Adam to my estate that they come in for
their fathers part which I will to be an equal
part with the rest of my children I desire
that my daughter Polly Ann shall pay

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Two hundred dollars for a negro man named Tom and
then to have an equal part of my estate with the
rest of my children I will that my daughter Bridget
L. Kault shall have one dollar out of my estate
exclusive of what she has already received. I will that
my daughter Sarah Hawkins after paying to my
estate the sum of two hundred dollars for a negro
woman named Edith that she shall have an equal
part of my estate with the rest of my children
I will that my daughter Fanny Woodard shall
have an equal part with the rest of my children
out of my estate I will that my daughter Nancy
Ring shall have an equal share of my estate
with the rest of my children after she pays
four hundred dollars for a negro girl named
Joseph I wish and desire that my sons James R.
Lewis & Peter B. Lewis Robert A. Lewis & William
D. Lewis to have an equal part of my estate
with the rest of my children I do desire that
this will should be punctually complied with
I shall appoint my two sons Peter B. Lewis & Robert
A. Lewis Executors of my beloved wife Elizabeth
Hiram under my hand this 10th day of September
