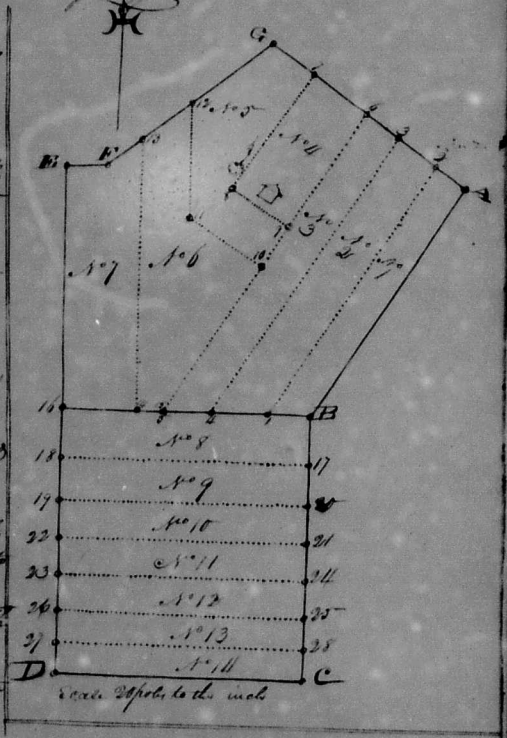
In pursuance of an order of the Honorable the County Court of Fleming, granting a division of Patrick Shammas deceased lands, to wit: the undersigned must up and saw several hundred acres, and the 7<sup>th</sup> of April 1819, which consists of five sub lots, in the Town of Flemingsburg, distinguished on the plat of said Town by Lots A<sup>o</sup> 6, 7, 8, 9 & 10 also are tract conveyed by George Stockton to said Shammas said to contain four & three fourths acres, 27 poles, also are other tract said to contain twenty acres, conveyed by Archibald Stockton to said Shammas and having run around the aforesaid lands and ascertained that they contain 54 acres, 28 poles, and then divided it into 14 lots, attesting each lot to have a lot of the improved and condemned land and a lot of timbering land of which the annexed plat and following notes will further explain.

Lot A<sup>o</sup> 1 part of the condemned & improved land containing three acres, fifty two poles & bounded as follows: Beginning at a stake on the south bank of Stockton Branch running through Flemingsburg said stake being the North East corner to Lot A<sup>o</sup> 10 and in the next boundary of Chain Creek street through said Town thence with said street south 88° N. 20 poles to B a stake thence

North 92° 40 poles to figure 1 a stake thence at 33° E 68 poles to 2 a stake in the aforesaid branch in the south boundary of the commons around the inlet of said Town thence with the commons S 56° E 50 poles to the Beginning Lot A<sup>o</sup> 2 part of condemned and improved land containing four & one half acres, 27 poles, and bounded as follows: Beginning at figure 1 corner to Lot 1 thence with the same at 33° E 68 poles to 3 a stake in the south boundary of commons thence with the commons North 56° W 10 poles to 4 a stake thence South 33° W 75 poles to 5 a stake thence East 15° 20 poles to the Beginning

Lot A<sup>o</sup> 3 part of condemned and improved land containing four acres one half & thirty three poles and bounded as follows: Beginning at figure 4 a stake thence with 11° 46 poles to 6 a stake thence at 33° E 83 poles to 6 a stake in South boundary of commons thence with the same S 56° E 94 poles to 8 a stake thence S 33° W 75 poles to the Beginning Lot A<sup>o</sup> 4 containing 3 acres 21 poles, including the dwelling house and part of the orchard occupied by Daniel Brown & bounded as follows: Beginning at 6 a stake thence with the commons at 56° W 15 poles to 7 a stake thence S 33° W 32 poles to 8 a stake thence S 56° E 15 poles to 9 a stake thence at 33° E 33 poles to the Beginning

Lot A<sup>o</sup> 5 containing four acres and seventy three poles, including the spring and part of the orchard & bounded as follows: Beginning at figure 7 a stake thence with 1° 44° 33° W 32 poles to 8 a stake thence S 56° E 15 poles to 9 a stake thence S 33° W 11 poles to 10 a stake thence North 56° W 20 poles to 11 a stake thence at 33° E 33 poles to 12 a stake in the south boundary of Chain Creek road thence with the



the same at  $55^{\circ} E 32 \frac{1}{2} N$  poles to C a stake in the south boundary of common apportion land with the same  $S 56^{\circ} E 12$  poles to the Beginning

Lot No 6 containing Two and three fourths acre 25 poles including part of the orchard and bounded as follows Beginning at 10 a stake thence with Lot No 5 at  $57^{\circ} N 56^{\circ} E$  poles to 11 a stake thence at  $7^{\circ} N 25^{\circ} E$  poles to 12 a stake thence with the road south  $53^{\circ} N 47^{\circ} E$  poles to 13 a stake thence  $60^{\circ} N$  poles to 14 a stake thence East  $52^{\circ} E$  poles to 15 a stake thence at  $33^{\circ} E 39 \frac{1}{2} N$  poles to the Beginning

Lot No 7 containing six acres & 25 poles and bounded as follows Beginning at 16 a stake and stump. Coryn & Shannon corner thence with their line  $S 7^{\circ} E 55^{\circ} E$  poles to 16 a stake thence East  $15^{\circ} E$  poles to 14 a stake thence at  $7^{\circ} N 60^{\circ} E$  to 13 a stake thence with road  $S 53^{\circ} N 67^{\circ} E$  poles to 11 a stake at  $188^{\circ} N 9^{\circ} E$  poles to the Beginning

Lot No 8 containing 4 acres part cleared & part timbered land and bounded as follows Beginning at figure 15 thence East  $5^{\circ} E$  poles to B a stake thence south  $11^{\circ} E$  poles to 17 a stake thence west  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to 18 a stake thence at  $7^{\circ} N 11^{\circ} E$  poles to the Beginning

Lot No 9 containing  $3 \frac{1}{2}$  acres of timbered land and bounded as follows Beginning at 18 thence south  $7^{\circ} E 9^{\circ} E$  poles to 19 a stake thence East  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to 20 a stake thence North  $9^{\circ} E$  poles to 17 a stake thence west  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to the Beginning

Lot No 10 three acres of timbered land & bounded as follows Beginning at 19 a stake thence East  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to 20 a stake thence South  $8^{\circ} E$  poles to 21 a stake thence west  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to 22 a stake thence at  $7^{\circ} N 8^{\circ} E$  poles to the Beginning

Lot No 11 Three acres of timbered land and bounded as follows Beginning at 22 a stake in Dorsey line thence with the same  $S 7^{\circ} E 8^{\circ} E$  poles to 23 a stake thence East  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to 24 a stake thence North  $8^{\circ} E$  poles to 21 a stake thence west  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to the Beginning

Lot No 12 Three acres of timbered land and bounded as follows Beginning at 23 a stake thence west  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to 24 a stake thence south  $8^{\circ} E$  poles to 25 a stake thence west  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to 26 a stake in Dorsey line thence with the same at  $7^{\circ} N 8^{\circ} E$  poles to the Beginning

Lot No 13 Five and one half acres of timbered land & bounded as follows Beginning at 25 a stake thence west  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to 26 a stake in Dorsey line thence with the same  $S 7^{\circ} E 7^{\circ} E$  poles to 27 a stake thence East  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to 28 a stake thence North  $7^{\circ} E$  poles to the Beginning

Lot No 14 Five and one half acres of timbered land & bounded as follows Beginning at 27 a stake thence East  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to 28 a stake thence South  $7^{\circ} E$  poles to C a stake in the road in Palmer's line near a small ash thence with Palmer's line west  $56^{\circ} E$  poles to D a stake in Dorsey line near a ash & white oak thence with Dorsey line at  $7^{\circ} N 7^{\circ} E$  poles to the Beginning

At a Court held for settling claims on the 7th day of February 1820 This division of land between the heirs of Patrick Shannon also by M. Shannon & companions was this day produced in books examined & ordered to be recorded which is done
