William Scott of the Town of Farmington
County of Fleming and State of Kentucky
being one of the Jury but of Sound and disposing
mind for the disposition of such Estate Real
and Personal as I Oath I make this my
Last Will and Testament in manner and form
following to wit.

That all my Last Wills and General
executors be paid as speedily as possible out
of a fund to be raised from a sale (or a Redemption)

create of such part of my Estate real or personal as may be
necessary for that purpose and if real estate should be sold for
that purpose my Executor hereinafter named shall convey
the same to the purchaser or purchasers by deed or deed and
if upon the presentation of any account or other demand against
my Estate in the hands of my Executor he shall be of opinion
that the same is just or ought to be paid I shall not be responsible
for him to discharge my Estate with the costs of substantiating
the same by Law.

Item I will give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Scott
all the residue of my Estate real and personal to have and
to hold the same to her and her heirs following to wit the residue of
my personal estate and one Bureau and feather bed and
bedding including a stand & curtains (her choice) and two
fast Sals and two (her choice) and to the value of five pounds
of such other articles of my property as she may choose
to her, her heirs and assigns forever her Power in my Last Estate
during her life and the Residue to be paid for my daughter
Mary Scott until she the the said Mary shall attain the
age of Eighteen years at which time it is my will that the
said balance after the appropriations aforesaid should be
cleared over (if retained that long in specie) to my said
daughter Mary Scott but if the same shall have been
sold then the proceeds thereof to be paid to the said Mary
to hold to her, her heirs and assigns forever.

It is further my will that the person or persons of whom I purchase
Land in the Town of Farmington and who have not yet
conveyed the same should upon demand thereof by my
Executor convey to him the said Executor as Executor so many
the of as may be necessary to pay debts as mentioned in the
first part of this my will and the Residue to my
daughter Mary Scott subject to the use expressed above
and lastly I hereby appoint my Father in Law John Dier
of Salisbury Town in the County aforesaid sole Executor
of this my Last will and Testament hereby Revoking
all other I former Wills by me made
