of Kentucky being inform and aware in body but of sound
and disposing memory. Do make this my last will and
Testament that a proper disposition and distribution may
be made of that Estate and then worldly goods wherewith
it has pleased an indulgent Providence to bless upon
me in this ~~life~~ life.

In the first place it is my will that upon my
decease my Body be committed to its burial in such an
account and Christian like manner as the
discretion of my Executors herein after named.

Now I will that my just debts and funeral expences
be as speedily paid as possible out of the money which
may be on hand at my decease if there be sufficient
for that purpose, but if there should be none on
hand or that on hand be insufficient for that
purpose that such debts and expences be paid from
the proceeds of a sale (upon a reasonable credit) of
the discretion of my Executors) of such a portion
of my personal goods and shall not herein
otherwise dispose of as may be sufficient for
that purpose.

Now I will and bequeath to my beloved wife and
Armstrong One fourth part of all which may
from time to time be raised by agriculture upon the
plantation upon which I now live on Allison to
be paid and delivered to her at such place on the
plantation aforesaid as she shall appoint, the corn
in the crib and every other description of produce
ready for market except the straw and hay
which shall be delivered as aforesaid in stack
to be used held and enjoyed by her as and for her
dower in said lands during her natural life.

I also will and bequeath to my said wife one horse
or mare her choice of my stock, two milk cows and
feather bed, bedstead and furniture her choice of those
which may be on hand the cupboard and all my
cupboard furniture, One spinning wheel, Parlor
One ten gallon bottle One three gallon pot and one
Bath's Oven to her the said Land her heirs and
assigns forever.

Now I will and bequeath to my Sons Robert John
and William Each One Equal third part of my land
and plantation on which I now reside lying on
Allison to be divided by themselves if they can agree
on such division but if not then by a Majority of
three men one to be chosen by for that purpose of
each of my Sons or the representatives of each of them
as may depart this life before such division and in any
division under this clause of my will respect is to be
had to quantity quality and convenience the Lands
herein devised to be held by my said Sons Robert
John and William in severalty as aforesaid to them their heirs
and assigns forever Subject to the rent of one fourth part
which may be raised herein by cuttings as secured to myself
in lieu of Dower in a former clause of this will - It is
further my will on this Subject that if at any time
during the natural life of my said wife my said
Sons or either of them should refuse or fail to cultivate
a reasonable proportion of their respective Shares, that
on such refusal or refusal my said wife may take such
measures to procure the cultivation thereof during such
failure, as she may think proper and the right of
such delinquency in the Lands shall be suspended
during such delinquency or the natural life of my said
wife. Now I will and bequeath to my daughter

both Christy wife of James Christy One Dollar current money to be paid by my Executors in one year after my decease.
 Then I will and bequeath to my Daughter Lydia Ann (wife of William Bowen) One Dollar current money to be paid by my Executors in one year after my decease.

Then I will and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Jenny Northcut Daughter of Benjamin Northcut and my late daughter Jane Northcut now deceased One hundred dollars each to be paid her or Guardians in one year after my decease. Also One young horse created One feather bed and furniture and a spinning wheel to her the said Jenny Northcut her heirs or assigns forever in lieu of the claims of the representatives of my said Daughter Jane Northcut deceased.

Then I will and bequeath to my son Samuel Armstrong One Dollar in cash to be paid by my Executors upon demand.

Then I will bequeath and devise to my sons Robert John Samuel and William Shaw and their assigns such of my lands held by patents from the commonwealth of Virginia on locations made by Col Wm Ward and their assigns under him therein as may be gained or secured to them my said sons in severally their heirs and assigns forever.

Then I will and bequeath to my beloved wife and the Service of my Negro woman Esther (during the natural life of my said wife and upon the decease of my said wife that the said Esther shall be free and from her self altogether Emancipated.

Then I will and bequeath to my said wife and daughter Nancy Bell (wife of Capt C Bell

and Polly Sumner (wife of Lewis Sumner) all the residue of my personal property not herein otherwise disposed of after paying my debts and funeral expenses as provided for in a former part of this will to be Equally divided between them and their by them in Severally after such division to them the said Jane, Nancy, &c. their heirs and assigns forever.

Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife and surviving Executors and my son Robert (Armstrong) Executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other and former wills by me made and declaring this and none other as my last will and testament.

In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and the sixth day of July One thousand Eight hundred and ten signed and acknowledged by ⁱⁿ Robert Armstrong to be as and for his last will and testament in his presence who have subscribed our names as witnesses thereto in his presence.
