widow of said decedent which includes the mansion
house on a certain four hundred and seventy three
and three fourths acre tract of land situated in
Fleming County whereon said decedent last lived
and conveyed by Thomas Roddy James Hughes
Robert Page and their wives to said Tully and
said decedent is bounded as follows Beginning
at the south west corner of the aforesaid tract of land
an elm and sugar tree thence with the South town
line thence north eighty and six pole East two hundred
and seven pole to a boxelder sugar tree &c
then the south East corner of the aforesaid tract
