Simon Morgan of the state of Virginia and county of Fauquier do make Lordin this my last ^{will} in manner and form as follows to wit

Imprimis It is my will and desire my Executors hereafter to be named do sell in any manner they may chuse all my Landed Estate which I now own or may hereafter receive in the state of Kentucky & Ohio my land in the state of Virginia lying in the County of Louisa & Hardy & Hampshire & Frederick which last tract I purchased of Charles M. Thornton Lord of the proceeds of said sales discharge all my Just Debt

Secondly I lend all my estate both real & personal excepted the lands above mentioned to my wife Elizabeth for her natural life and at her death it is my will and desire that that the whole be equally divided between my children to wit

Lucy P. Morgan, Charles M. Morgan, Jane Morgan, Nancy P. Morgan, Eliza M. Morgan, Manal M. Morgan, Geo Morgan, Will Morgan

to them & their heirs forever Further it is my will & desire that if the lands above directed to be sold shall bring more than will discharge all my just debts that the overplus shall be paid to my said wife Elizabeth to be disposed of as she may think proper

Lastly I appoint my two sons Charles M. Daniel Morgan ^{executors} of this my last will.

At a court held for Fauquier County the
25th day of July 1810 this will was read by the
Oaths of Thornton Buckner and Jas Kemper wit-
nesses Thence and ordered to be recorded at a court
Continued Thence for the said County the 26th day of July
1810 On the motion of Daniel Morgan ^{one of the} exec-
utors therein named who made oath together with
Geo J. Skelton Junr. & the said Thornton Buckner
his securities entered into and acknowledged Bond in
the penalty of Ten thousand dollars conditioned as the law
directly & certified to is granted him for obtaining a probate
in due form Teste J. H. Caffee S. T. C.
