

entirely good & possession of both please god to bestow upon me I leave and bequeath in the following manner In witness I leave to my wife Ann my one thousand six hundred and sixty six dollars and two thirds of a dollar, also one Negro man named Brooks also the plantation wherein I now live containing about sixty acres also two horses, three cows one Wagon & pigs with every other utensil belonging to the farm also all and every the household furniture —

I leave & bequeath to my eldest son William one thousand dollars, I leave and bequeath to my son David Elton hundred and fifty dollars. I leave & bequeath to my son Abraham Elton hundred and fifty dollars. I leave & bequeath to my son Isaac Elton hundred and fifty dollars. I leave and bequeath to my daughter Abigail

Elton five hundred and fifty dollars but as my money is out upon Bonds and the above legacies cannot be paid before my death then the same it is my Will that five hundred dollars be paid to my wife out of the first they receive and the remainder equally divided amongst the several Legates according to their share and as they receive they my Eldest son to pay in like manner until the whole of the Legacy be paid off and in case of any money remaining it is to be equally divided amongst the several Legates according to their respective shares and I do constitute and appoint my two sons Abraham & Isaac of this my Will revoking and annulling any will or will herebefore made by me or in my name, Ratifying & confirming this and this only to be my Last Will & Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of January One thousand eight hundred and
