This day I Thomas Finney of Fleming County and State of Kentucky being very weak and unable to get in my right mind and judgment about coming to execute the mortgagable of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and declare this my last will in Testaments that is to say I give and bequeath to Marjorie my beloved wife the whole of my Estate real and personal during her life to be at her expense and for her issue while she lives and after her death the same to be divided Equally among the well behaved only I am to have fifth parts more than any of the rest if any of my children behaves bad or drunkardly or leary or behaves unbecomingly to Christians let them have not more than one dollar of my Estate apiece And the rest to be divided among the well behaved after her decease This is given in her own right to give Andrew a horse and saddle for as the he behaves well I want near Thomas near Marjorie's death I want all and the same back and I claim no right in the same then even further I will that she buy lands when and where she pleases as soon as my money can be got and to lay out the rest of the for improvement for their convenient living And I desire my son James to assist me in all the business and concerns of my Estate In witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal the Eleventh day of February and thousand eight hundred and eighth years by Thomas Finney

Among my Sons and Daughters to wit William Chapman, Joshua Plummer, Mary Plummer, William Chapman, Manica Plummer & Praman Chapman, Sarah Chapman and Nancy Chapman; Only William Plummer has had Twenty One dollars and twelve and half Cents worth of Land which he stands charged with and which said Land shall be reduced of Joshua his wife's Share — And further
