I Thomas McDaniel of Fleming County State of Kentucky being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory do make constitute said and this my last Will & Testament that is to say principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that give it and touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give over & dispose of the same in the following manner & for viz. First I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Lemmy McDaniel (whom I constitute & appoint the sole executrix of this my last will & testament) all my real & present estate to have hold & enjoy the same without appraisement said distribution of any article or part thereof (only as she may direct) for her only proper use & benefit during her widowhood or natural lifetime (if she shall or does so long run and my executors &

I do hereby direct that my said executor
 their (administrators in case of her
 decease or inability) shall pay out of
 my personal estate all my just debts
 and such other legacies as are hereinafter
 given & bequeathed to each of my
 children (that is) first to my first
 three eldest daughters namely Mary Catherine
 Eliza Lightmaster & Susanna Lightmaster
 who have heretofore received a considerable
 part of my estate to each of them twenty
 shillings only at the discretion of my
 said executrix that each of my younger
 children (to wit) Henry McDaniel, John
 McDaniel Harrison, McDaniel, and
 William McDaniel, have heretofore
 received each of them out of my personal
 estate fifty dollars worth of property
 & Elizabeth McDaniel thirty dollars worth
 I direct that my said daughter McDaniel shall
 have twenty dollars worth of property more
 paying to her at the discretion of my said executrix
 that each of my younger children
 (to wit) Henry McDaniel, John McDaniel
 Harrison, McDaniel, Nancy McDaniel, &
 Newcomen, McDaniel shall have fifty dollars
 worth of property at its great value paying to
 each of them out of my personal estate by my
 said executrix or administrators then thirty
 after the marriage or decease of my wife
 Henry McDaniel I direct that and my

my real & personal estate shall
 be appraised sold & equally & impartially
 divided among each of my children here-
 to named (that is to say) Degebrook, Hen-
 ried Thomas, McDaniel, Wm, McDaniel
 Henry McDaniel John McDaniel Harrison
 McDaniel Nancy McDaniel, Newcomen
 McDaniel lastly and hereby utterly disallow
 revoke & disannul all and every other former
 or statements will legacy & bequest by me in
 any way before named will & bequeathed
 ratifying & confirming this & no other
 to be my last will & testament in testimony
 whereof I Thomas McDaniel have
 hereunto set my hand & seal this thirtieth
 day of March 1818
