declare this my last Will and Testament that is to say
principally and first of all I give and recommend my
soul to GOD that gives it and my body I recommend
to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian like
burial nothing doubting but at the great resurrection
I shall receive the same given by the mighty power of
GOD and as touching such worldly estate with which
GOD has blessed me he bless me with in this world
I give devise and dispose of in the following manner.

I do give and bequeath to my ^{beloved} wife Annis all
my Land and premises that lie on the South side
of Locust including the Dwelling House where we
now live during her Widowhood and to my
son I do give all my Land and premises on the
North side of Locust that is to say my son Thomas which
Land is in the new Survey that I now live on and as
to my goods and moveable Estate I do give as
follows To my wife Annis I give the Equall half of
all my goods and moveable property during her
widowhood and as to the other half of my goods
and moveable property I give as follows to John and
William Susanah Samu^{el} and Samuel the hole to
be Equally divided between my beloved wife and them
five above named children except what I give
out of their part to the other children after my
last death as paid and as to the Land and

premises that I have given to my beloved wife after her
widowhood I do give to my children as follows Sally shall
have Jane Alexander Rebecca Alexander and Polly
Alexander and do give and allow to the above mentioned
Sally Jane Rebecca and Polly twenty shillings a
year to be paid out of the Equall half of my moveable
moveable Estate that is given to the other five children
it is my will and must and is to be understood
that I give John and William Susanah Samu^{el} and
Samuel their Equall proportion of the Land given to
my beloved wife after her widowhood to be Equall with
Sally Jane Rebecca and Polly and that the Land may
be sold and the price equally divided amongst them
Given in my hand and seal as my last will
and Testament this thirty first day of May in the year
of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ten
