I declare this to be my last will & testament
I do dispose of my estate as follows I find
I will bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth
the rent & profits of my land whereon
I now live for and during her widowhood
for the purpose of supporting herself my child-
ren that is under age but if my wife should
marry she is then to have only
one third of the said land & premises during
her life I also give & bequeath unto my said
wife one negro boy woman named Hannah
for & during term of eight years from & after
my Death (at the expiration of said eight years
it is my will that the said Hannah shall
be and be emancipated & free) the future increase
of the said Hannah during the time of
her servitude is to be free respectively at the
age of thirty five years & to be at the dis-
posal of my said wife that is she may
divide them (if any there should be) amongst
her present children as she may think proper
also I give to my said wife during her
life the interest & profits of my Bank stock in
the Bank of Lexington & if the balance

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Of the shares in said stock should be
called in by said bank it is to be paid in
out of my estate I also give to my wife one
third of my personal estate, to her and her heirs
forever. I give and bequeath to my son Jay ten
one negro boy now about fifteen months old
named Henry, until the said ^{negro boy} Henry shall arrive
at the age of thirty five years at which time the said
Henry is to be emancipated & free I will bequeath all
the remainder of my estate of every description to my
children to wit William Linton John Nancy Ann
James Thomas Joseph Elizabeth Mary Clayton & their
heirs & equally except that James Thomas & he
are each to receive one hundred dollars more than
the rest of my said children out of the estate hereby
bequeathed & jointly to all my children & whenas I
have advanced to sum of my children money &c
all which I stand charged to them on my books
upon the settlement there accounts are to be taken in
to estimation and to be considered as part of their por-
tions It is my will that upon the death of my wife
that my land & premises should be sold on a reasonable
credit at public sale by my executor or the survivors
of them & the proceeds thereof to be divided between
my aforesaid children & my executor hereafter named
or the survivors or survivor of them are ^{hereby} authorized
to convey the same to the purchaser or purchasers
I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint
Dudley Leamon & Stockton Linton Dudley executors
of this my last will & testament hereby now being

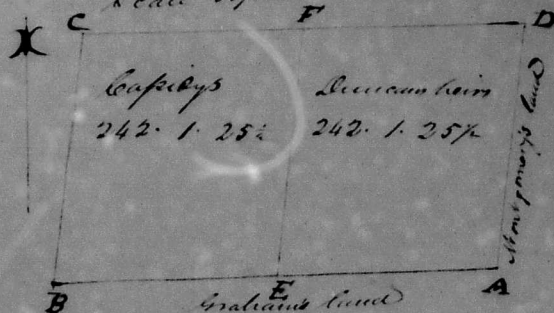
