 bequeath the one third of my stock of hogs and sheep
 also six powder plates, one powder boxes & one powder dish
 Second unto my wife Sarah I give and bequeath
 all my stock of horses cattle the balance of the
 sheep and hogs with all my farming utensils, kitchen
 utensils and household furniture of every description
 except what I have bequeathed unto my son William
 Hill. My land and all its appurtenances thereto belonging
 with my negro man slave & Sulphony I also bequeath unto
 my wife Sarah as long as she shall live not to
 be sold or parted with and at the death of my
 wife Sarah then shall they be the property of my
 son William Hill. Third I also wish that Benjamin
 Bravard and Adam Lee be appointed Executors
 to this my last will and Testament signed sealed and
 acknowledged this second day of July in the year
 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred Twenty one
 in the presence of us
