In the name of God amen I William Lefflips of Fleming County and State of Kentucky Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be almighty God for the same do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say First I gave and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Lefflips one third part of all my Land and medicable property during her natural life and at her decease all her third part of the Land to be my son William Lefflips with all the rest of the Land I give to my son William the young gray mare called Kate and his saddle & bridle with the rifle gun and shot gun and his choice of the two best sheep I give and bequeath to my Daughter Polly Lefflips a young red unmarked cow and her side saddle and then all the balance of medicable property to be Equally Divided between my two Daughters Mary & Nancy Lefflips and I appoint my son William Lefflips and my friend Robert Marshall Executors of this my last will and testament hereby recovering all former wills by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and this 18 day of February 1845

In the name of God amen I James Magowan of Fleming County State of Kentucky being weak in body and very infirm but of sound and disposing mind and memory blessed be God for his mercies do constitute this my last will and testament disposing all other wills and testaments impotent I will that my body be buried with Christian decency at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and unto my worldly Estate I will that my funeral Charges and just debts be first paid and discharged Item I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susan Magowan one full third part of all my Estate both real and personal that part of real Estate for and during her natural life & that part of my personal Estate to her and her heirs and assigns forever - Item I will and bequeath unto my sons James M. Magowan Johnathan Magowan Harvey Magowan and Abraham Magowan and to my Daughter Nancy Lefflips and Rachel Magowan all the residue of my Estate both real & personal to be divided equally among them to them & their heirs and assigns forever excepting such provisions and exceptions as are hereafter specified and made Item Item it is my will that two male white children named Matt and Linda Daughters of Negro Pat shall be free when they arrive at the age of twenty one year and also that my negro man Sam be free in one year after my Decease Item I will that my Executors pay unto my sister Jane Magowan out of the proceeds of my personal Estate one hundred pounds current money &c &c It is my desire that equal distribution be made of the residue of my Estate and that equal justice be done to my before mentioned Children and I have already advanced to some of them sundry sums in money and other
