thanks be to the almighty God, and willing to remove
beyond the uncertain state of this transitory life and that
all flesh must yield to death when it shall please
God to call, do make this and ordain it to be my
Last Will and Testament in the manner & form
following, First being ^{fully} sorry for all my sins most humbly
asking forgiveness for the same. I commend my soul
to almighty God my saviour and Redeemer in whom alone
I trust and believe assuredly to be saved and
to have full remission and forgiveness and my body I am
to be decently buried at the discretion of my
Executor here appointed and for the settling of my last legal
Estate and such goods, Chattels and Debts as it shall please
God to bestow on me I do give and bequeath the same
in manner and form following, that is to say, First after
paying away lawfull Debts the remainder of my Estate
I require to be sold by way of Vendue and an equal divided
money amongst all my Children except Margaret Clifton
because who has already received her part also allowing my
wife Elizabeth Morgan her share and do hereby make and
ordain my beloved wife Elizabeth Morgan & Edward Morgan
my executors full and sole Executors of this my last
will and Testament hereby making an utter revoking
of all former wills by me made declaring this only to be
my last will and Testament - In testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of March 1800

above mentioned. Also I leave to my said wife a black two year
old mare now in my possession, also all my stock of swine, also
all my household furniture of every kind with all my farming
utensils, And I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my
beloved friend and father in law George Hammon whole sole executor
of this my last will and Testament making void and annulling
all wills or wills heretofore made by me Confirming this and
this only to be my last will and Testament, In Witness
