Now the same of J^{es} Andrew & George Middleton sons of Fleming County and Benjamin & John of Sturtevant being of sound mind & perfect memory the undersigned in the uncertainty of mortality to make publick this my last will and testament thereby declaring and amending all former wills it with by me made and made and from following.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Middleton also the good she brought to me and our union also the children and all the China & Peacock ware belonging thereto & all the plate & Bureau & half a dozen window chairs. the black also two negro girls named Bet & Lena & two girls named Sarah to serve her two heirs & assigne until they and each of them shall come to the age of thirty five and then each to go out and get an husband and give together with their several offsprings bond before that time the said offsprings serving the like period until they severally arrive to the age of thirty five years old and so on forever. Also one large dining table. Also one third part of the stock or increase thereof since we were married also my son Man William & his wife Sarah for and during his natural life & that he receive I will that they be free, also one negro and my wife having purchased the same with her funds.

I also secondly give and give to my four eldest sons George, Joshua, John and Edward, to them each one dollar to be paid by executor, hereafter named and then already given each of them more than I have to give my younger children

I also thirdly give and bequeath unto my Daughter Phoebe Barnes the place and parcel of land which she now lives & resides according to a survey by the surveyor of Benjamin Williams, Daniel Seaton, David Early, John Moore & my wife & it is to be understood that my wife

that any Daughter shall enjoy said farms with all the benefits among Christians for and during life and he has decreed to go to his heirs. Sonny, I do give unto my Daughter, Thea Barnes, some hundred dollars to be paid by my Executor hereafter to be married within two years after my decease to be paid out of my estate and yet devised.

Here I finally I give unto my ^{sons} Leath, Robert, & Dorsey all the farms I now have to be equally divided between them according to quantity and quality to them and their heirs forever. I do give my son Leath a negro boy named Aaron which is now two or three years old. Also to my son Robert one negro girl named Rachel and to my son Dorsey one negro boy named Bill below twelve and thirteen years old to serve them severally until they arrive to the age of thirty five at which time the said negro Bill to be free also said negro Rachel is to be free at my the age of thirty five, and his measure that may be born before that time period each to serve until they severally arrive to the age of thirty five years one single but to be free also I give unto my sons Leath, Robert, & Dorsey my negro man Sam to serve seven years from and after my decease also one negro boy named Carter to serve until he shall arrive to the age of thirty five years and also one small girl named Edy to serve until she arrive to the age of thirty five and any increase she may have prior to that time to serve in like manner until they severally arrive to the age of thirty five but the above stated period the ~~above~~ said negroes to be

Emancipated upon the said negroes to be equally divided between them together with all the rest and residue of my estate ~~into~~ before divided real personal or mixed.

Also finally I do the bequest of my wife I do give my maid William and Sarah to serve her for and during life as they are good servants my wish is to emancipate them eventually and I am certain it is that of my wife also. Therefore my will and desire is that they marry William and his wife Sarah serve my wife for and during three years at the end of which time I will that my ~~sons~~ ^{sons and in that case} be them free and do hope my beloved wife shall live before the end of three years they are to go and free also.

Sixthly and lastly I do nominate and appoint my three sons Leath, Robert, and Dorsey Executors of this my last will and testament by me made and witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty ninth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen.
