 In the Court of Lord Amos I James Dale of Kentucky last will and Testament
 being weak of body but of sound and perfect mind and memory do hereby bequeath and give for the same to my wife and to each of my last will and Testament in manner and form following viz.

First, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Abigail Dale her full share of the personal estate for movable for ever and the third of the profits of the said estate during her natural life or widowhood

Secondly, I do give and bequeath to my grand Daughter Sally Dale to say the sum of fifty Dollars at my death and the money to be put to interest ~~until~~ until she arrives at the age of Eighteen years but if said Sally should not live to above age or have any lawful issue then the said money is to belong to her mother

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sally one bed and Bedding being the same which now goes by her name

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to John Taylor my nephew fifty acres of land off the plantation or land whereon I now live and is laid off for ever to him his heirs and assigns

And I give I give I give and bequeath to my son John Dale the remaining part of my Plantation consisting of one hundred and sixty acres with all the improvements thereon to him the said John Dale his Executors and administrators forever

And Lastly the remaining two thirds of real estate or personal estate I give and bequeath as follows, To George William Arney Esq and Sarah Taylor and to John Dale and Jane Dale Esq there and there heirs And thereby appoint George Taylor sole executor of this my last will and Testament thereby revoking all former wills by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this twentieth Day of March In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen

I William M. Whipple of the County and State of Pennsylvania
being very sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and
memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto
mine the morality of my body knowing it is appointed
unto all men once to die do make and ordain this
my last will and Testament that is to say principally
and first of all I give and recommend my soul into
the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body
I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent
Christian burial at the direction of my Executors testifying
Nothing doubting but at the General resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the Almighty Power of God
And as touching such worldly estate as the ^{whereof} he hath pleased
the Holy Spirit to bestow on this life I give devise and dispose
if he should see the following manner and form

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First I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth
McBride two head headstead and clothing one spinning
wheel and my husband and a furniture and a wardrobe
which she now has out of her equal proportion of the
rest of my estate to be delivered to her at my decease.
Also I give and bequeath to my son John M. Whipple one
horse and saddle now called his share of his equal proportion
of the rest of my estate
I also give and bequeath to my two sons John and Abraham
McBride five acres of wheat now growing to be equally divided
between them which is also to be out of their equal
proportion of the remainder of my estate
All the remainder of my personal estate I wish to be sold
at twelve months credit and equally divided amongst
my children to be paid them as they become of age or
marry
As touching my land and plantations I wish to be divided
among my youngest child because of age and the profits
thereof to be appropriated to the raising and
schooling my children and also my youngest child
because of age I wish my land to be sold by auction
either before at public auction or he may think best
where I also nominate and appoint sole exe-
cutor of the my last will and testament and the
money arising from the sale of the land to be equally
divided between all my children I furthermore hereby
revoke and annul all former wills gifts bequesting
and confirming the and no other to be my last will
and Testament in testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand
